

## Woburn Lower School

### Pupil Premium Action Plan (Includes PP+ and SC)

2023 - 2024

Pupil Premium Funding was introduced by the Government in 2011 to be used to improve outcomes for disadvantaged learners and close the gap between them and their peers.

Pupil Premium + Funding was introduced in 2013 to be allocated to supporting looked after and previously looked after children. At Woburn Lower School we are committed to ensuring that our Pupil Premium, Pupil Premium + and Service Child Funding and provision impacts positively on achievement, attendance and pastoral care. We consider carefully the best way to allocate Pupil Premium money and Service Premium money according to the needs of the individual pupils and to remove barriers to learning.

Service Premium Funding was introduced by the Government in 2011 in recognition of the specific challenges children from service families' face. Eligible schools receive the SPF so that they can offer mainly pastoral support during challenging times and to help mitigate the negative impact on service children of family mobility or parental deployment.

<b>Barriers to learning:</b>	The school is aware of the impact that school closure due to Covid 19 has had on all children.				
	Each of our children have their own individual needs and reactive intervention is differentiated accordingly. At present, none of our pupil premium and pupil premium + children are on the school's SEND register.				
	Low attendance can be a barrier to learning. The attendance of these children is monitored and at present is not giving cause for concern.				
	Financial considerations are taken into account as a possible barrier to learning: PP and PP+ children are given free school milk, free school dinners and school trips and visits are paid for by the school. Funding is also given for children to participate in any extra curriculum activities that they choose.				
	Social and emotional wellbeing can be a barrier to learning so the school is pro-active in this area and all children have access to pastoral support. We also aim to develop the confidence of these children by ensuring that they have the opportunity to take up leadership roles within the class and the school.
