Pupil Premium Funding was introduced by the Government in 2011 to be used to improve outcomes for disadvantaged learners and close the gap between them and their peers.

Pupil Premium + Funding was introduced in 2013 to be allocated to supporting looked after and previously looked after children. At Woburn Lower School we are committed to ensuring that our Pupil Premium, Pupil Premium + and Service Child Funding and provision impacts positively on achievement, attendance and pastoral care. We consider carefully the best way to allocate Pupil Premium money and Service Premium money according to the needs of the individual pupils and to remove barriers to learning.

Eligible schools receive the SPF so that they can offer mainly pastoral support during challenging times and to help mitigate the negative impact on service children of family mobility or parental deployment.
